AWARD HISTORY



NEW ZEALAND CUP

Winner

First presented in 1926 by an anonymous donor, later established as Mrs R. S. McInnes, first President of the New Zealand Basketball Association, for winners of the NZ Tournament. When the tournament is divided into grades, the New Zealand Cup is competed for by First Grade teams.

ANNIE BROWN CUP

Runner-up

In 1929 it was donated by Mrs W. Brown, then President of Canterbury Association, for runners-up at NZ Tournament. It is now the trophy for runners-up in the First Grade. Mrs Brown was active in basketball/netball for many years and was affectionately known as 'Auntie' Brown throughout the country.

LADY JUNE BLUNDELL SILVER SALVER

For highest number of goals scored

In 1977 it was presented to N.Z.N.A by Lady June Blundell on her retirement as Patroness to be awarded to the team with the highest number of goals scored.

VIOLET GILMOUR TROPHY

For lowest goals scored against

In 1948 a rosebowl was presented by the Mayor of New Plymouth, Mr E. Gilmour, in the name of his wife, to be awarded to the team, irrespective of grade, with the lowest average of goals scored against during a NZ Tournament.

GISBORNE CUP

For standard of playing uniform

In 1956 the Mayor of Gisborne, Mr H. H. Barker, was so impressed with the appearance of the teams in the Street Parade held prior to Tournament in Gisborne that he asked permission to donate a trophy. This cup is awarded for neatness and uniformity of team uniforms and general demeanour.



NetballSmart Netball New Zealand Open Champs format for 2023:

- 1. Nineteen (19) teams entered
- 2. Initial section seeding based on 2022 Open Champs results with the note that;
 - a. Where there are two teams from one Centre, or more than two teams from one Zone the seeding has been managed with some teams seeding's altered with other teams.
 - b. Seeding movement is limited to no more than three positions.
 - Teams that did not compete in 2022 are seeded at the bottom of each section.
 - d. Where teams have not entered in 2023 all teams are moved up in seeding and then re-ranked.
- 3. Initial pools 3 pools of 5, 1 pool of 4 Pools A, B, C, D.
- 4. Phase one round robin (3 or 4 games):
 - a. All teams play each other in their pool. Draws are permitted.
 - Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday (morning only) All teams play 1 or 2 games each day in round robin
 - c. At end of Phase one round robin, all teams are re-ranked based on position within their pool that is A1, A2, A3, A4, A5 etc.
- 5. Phase two Post-Section play all teams are allocated into three groups games that must play to a result will be indicated on the draw:
 - a. Top two teams from each section move into the TOP 8 playing for 1st to 8th.
 - b. Third and fourth placed team in each section move into the MIDDLE 8 playing for 9th to 16th.
 - c. Fifth placed teams in each section move to the BOTTOM 3 playing for 17th 19th.

- Q1 will be a development side from Dunedin they will not earn points in the competition, so won't place, but will play B5, C5 & D5 so they have an equal amount of games during the tournament
- 6. Teams will play a total of 6 or 7 games
- 7. Teams will have a minimum of two rounds off between games
- All teams will have a minimum of 1 game per day unless B5 (Central Lakes),
 C5 (Christchurch Black) or D5 (Howick Pakuranga) place in the top 2 of their pool. If this happens they will not play any games on Thursday

- The NetballSmart Netball New Zealand Open Champs will be conducted in accordance with the NNZ Competition Regulations with reference to the Policies and Procedures as contained in the Netball New Zealand Open Champs Event Guidelines and other Netball NZ Event Policies and Procedures.
- 2 Entries for the Netball New Zealand Open Champs shall be accepted from Netball Centres. Players must be female.
- Players participating in the Netball New Zealand Open Champs must be members of Netball New Zealand and eligible for the Centre they are representing at the Championships in accordance with Netball NZ Membership & Registration Regulations.
- 4 Netball New Zealand reserves the right to accept entries from parties other than Netball Centres in New Zealand.
- The Centre shall be responsible to ensure that all players selected for the Centre are eligible. Proof of date of birth (Birth Certificate, Passport) and/or eligibility may be requested by Netball NZ.
- 6 Players can only play in two of the three Netball New Zealand Domestic Events (Under 18 Champs, Open Champs and NZ Secondary School Champs) in a calendar year.
- No more than three (3) ANZ Premiership players are eligible to compete for any one team at the Netball NZ Open Champs. For the 2023 Netball NZ Open Champs an ANZ Premiership Player is defined as a player who has been contracted on a standard playing agreement for the 2024 ANZ Premiership season.
- Netball New Zealand shall circulate all team registration forms to each Zone/Centre no less than two weeks prior to the commencement of the championships. Any eligibility issues regarding players listed on these team lists must be raised one week prior to the commencement of the championships. For any players added subsequently eligibility issues must be raised following the distribution of updated team lists the night before the commencement of the championship.
- 9 Any team found to be in breach of the Netball NZ Membership & Registration Regulations will forfeit the game(s), in which that player(s) participated and will lose any corresponding championship points.
- Where multiple teams are entered from one Centre the teams must be ranked with team 1 being the strongest, team 2 the second and team 3 the least etc.
- 11 Each team shall be under the control of a Coach and Manager or combination thereof.
- Each team shall identify a Primary Care person on the team list only this person will be permitted onto the court in the event of a stoppage to attend to on court player/s. Each team shall be issued with an armband prior to each game which the Primary Care person must wear in order to be permitted access to the court.
- Each team must register a minimum of ten players and a maximum of twelve players on the Team Registration form.
- All games shall be played in accordance with World Netball rules, unless otherwise stated in these rules and/or the Netball NZ Open Champs Event Policies and Procedures.



- Games will consist of four (4) periods of twelve (12) minutes with intervals of four (4) minutes between the 1st & 2nd, and 3rd & 4th periods and an interval of six (6) minutes between the 2nd & 3rd periods.
- Players on court may ask the Umpire for a stoppage without the reasons of injury/illness or blood being required. All other procedures around the stoppage are conducted as per current International Rules.
- 17 All games shall be played with netballs supplied by Netball NZ.
- 18 The umpires for all games shall be appointed by Netball New Zealand.
- 19 A team registration form and player profile forms shall be submitted to Netball New Zealand no later than the date as determined by Netball New Zealand, by each team entered.
- 20 The team registration form and individual player profile forms shall detail the full name, date of birth and playing position(s) of each player, and any other information requested by Netball New Zealand.
- 21 Each player listed shall endorse her consent to team registration by providing the information for the player profile form.
- For the duration of the Netball NZ Open Champs, teams shall use only those players named on the final team list signed off on the evening prior to the commencement of the championship. If a player not named on this form plays in a game, the team concerned shall forfeit the game unless the replacement of a player on the registered team sheet has been approved by Netball New Zealand prior to the game concerned.
- Once Netball NZ Open Champs play has commenced the list of registered players of any team may be altered only if, in the opinion of a medical practitioner, a player(s) is (are) deemed to be incapable of further participation in the Netball NZ Open Champs. In such a case, additional eligible player(s) may be registered provided that at no time the total number exceeds twelve (12).
- Teams are able to replace an injured or ill player with a player from their Centre's lower ranked team at the event (see rule 23). This player will then become a member of this team and will no longer be eligible to play for their original team. Teams are not able to replace players with someone from a higher ranked team. The lower ranked team is then permitted to add a new player to their team to replace the one that moved up to the higher ranked team.
- 25 Evidence of a player's eligibility as a replacement registration may be requested by NNZ as detailed in rules 3 and 5.
- 26 Each team shall play in the registered uniform of the Centre.
- All players shall be identified through names on their playing uniform or numbers on their uniform or body.
- 28 If alternative bibs are required for identification purposes the teams shall toss to decide who shall wear them.

RULES



- No less than 30 minutes before a match commences, a team official must submit as directed by tournament officials a Team List. This will list all players taking the court, to commence the game, all substitute players and team officials. For games, that are televised, the team lists as above must be handed in at the time specified by Netball New Zealand prior to the scheduled start of the game.
- Only those players and team officials named on the Team List may participate in that game and be in the team bench area. No other personnel are allowed to sit in or on the team bench area throughout the game. For the avoidance of doubt this includes spectators and parents.
- No alterations or additions may be made to the team list within 30 minutes of the scheduled commencement time, except in the event of any injury/illness in the 30 minutes prior to the start of the game; a change in playing position(s) may be permitted if in the opinion of a medical practitioner the player is deemed to be incapable of commencing and/or participating in that game. In such a case, Netball NZ officials are to be notified immediately and subsequently the bench officials will be notified. For televised games the time period is in accordance with that specified by Netball New Tealand.
- 32 Teams are required to complete all games as specified in the draw format failure to do so may result in the forfeiture of points or rankings.
- 33 Teams shall not be required to play more than two games on any day, except in the event:
 - i. That a fair draw cannot be completed within the Netball NZ Open Champs; or
 - ii. That a protest is upheld. The Netball NZ Open Champs Event Committee may then require an additional game to be played. Consideration shall be given to scheduling this game at a time, which allows appropriate recovery time for the teams concerned.
- To avoid confusion team placement for each game will be allocated on the following basis:
 - (a) Team 1 on the draw will take the area to the RIGHT of the score bench as it faces out on to the playing court.
 - (b) Team 2 on the draw will take the area to the LEFT of the score bench as it faces out on to the playing court.
- 35 During section or pool play points will be awarded as follows:

4 points Win 2 points Draw

1 point Loss of 3 goals or less 0 points Loss by more than 3 goals

- In the event of a tie on points at the end of pool rounds, the result of the game between the two teams decides the winner. However;
 - If the two teams drew their match, or if more than two teams have the same number of points at the end of the pool rounds, goal average of the pool games will decide the placing (i.e. goals for divided by goals against).
 - ii. If goal average is identical, then goal difference will be applied (i.e. the difference between goals for and goals against).
 - iii. In the event of a further tie, the team scoring the most goals will be declared the winner.



- In the playoff and/or final rounds of the Championships, no draws are permitted. Such games shall be identified on the draw. In the event that the score is level at full-time, there will be:
 - A one (1) minute interval at the end of full-time where substitutions and/or team changes can be made. All other stoppage provisions apply during the entire duration of Extra Time.
 - ii. Extra time of two (2) x three (3) minute halves each way will be played.
 - iii. Teams will have a one (1) minute interval between halves.
 - iv. Teams change ends and the game is restarted by the team entitled to the next centre pass.
 - v. At the end of the second period/half of extra time the end of play shall be indicated through audible signal and umpire alert. Play shall be held while the score is confirmed. If the two teams remain tied then play shall resume from the point where it was when the end of the second period/half was signalled, with the ball and possession commenced as it was when the second period of extra time ended. Play will continue until one team has a two (2) goal advantage.
 - vi. To indicate that the game has entered extended extra time as in (v) a visual signal will be placed on the score bench.
- In the event of a dispute or incident report, any protests shall be made in writing to the Netball NZ Open Champs Event Committee within one (1) hour of the incident occurring or the completion of the game and prior to any official presentation, and accompanied by a fee of \$20.00. The fee shall be forfeited if the protest is considered to have been made without reasonable cause.
- Upon receipt of a protest, or incident report the Netball NZ Open Champs Event Committee shall obtain the views of the other team and/or participants to the incident giving rise to the protest, or incident report and make such other enquiries, as it considers necessary. Before making a determination of the protest or incident report, it shall then inform the team protesting of the views of the other team/participants and any information it has obtained regarding the incident and give it an opportunity to respond to such views. Following this exchange of views, the Netball NZ Open Champs Event Committee shall consider the protest or incident report as soon as possible and make a determination. It shall advise the relevant teams and other parties of its decision regarding the protest or incident report as soon as possible.
- The Netball NZ Open Champs is a Smokefree Netball Event. All participants and officials must refrain from smoking or vaping while at the Championship venue or at any Championship function.
- No participant, team or official of the Netball NZ Open Champs shall be permitted to be sponsored by a tobacco or vaping product nor be permitted to advertise or sell a tobacco or vaping product while at the Netball NZ Open Champs consistent with the Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products Act 1990 and its amendments.
- 42 Sponsorship: The permitted size and positioning on apparel is detailed in the following document; Apparel Branding Rules & Guidelines 2023. Centres must abide by the rules in these documents and refer to Netball New Zealand for approval.
- 43 Individual player sponsorship is not permitted, unless otherwise agreed with Netball New Zealand in advance in writing.



- Where under garment clothing or support items (for the avoidance of doubt an example of a support item is a calf sleeve) are worn by players on court, for reasons which may include but are not limited to; warmth, injury support and/or performance, then such items must be the same main colour as the players uniform/dress OR a neutral colour (black, white or beige). All items worn by any one player must be the same colour.
- At all matches, those teams playing in the match may display one sign or banner, the placement of which will be determined by Netball NZ. The signs are to measure 2.4 metres by 0.6 metres landscape orientation. Signs must be freestanding while any banners must be attached for display as directed by NNZ. Signs or banners not meeting these specifications will not be permitted to be displayed. Such signs shall depict only the team sponsor's name and/or logo. No apparel manufacturer or other signage shall be permitted unless otherwise agreed with Netball New Zealand in advance in writing.
- If any dispute arises from the interpretation of these rules or the need arises to deal with any matter not provided for in the rules, reference in writing shall be made to or by Netball New Zealand whose decision shall be binding on all parties.
- Netball New Zealand has the right to amend or make additions to these rules as required and from time to time. Any rule updates will be circulated to all parties as required.



NETBALL NZ GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT & ETHICS

As a Member of Netball NZ you must meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct during any activity held by or under the auspices of Netball NZ, a Zone or a Netball Centre and in any role you hold within Netball NZ, a Zone or a Netball Centre:

- 1. Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- 2. Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others.
- 3. Be professional in, and accept responsibility for your actions.
- 4. Make a commitment to providing quality service.
- 5. Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with persons under 18 years of age.
- 6. Be aware of, and maintain an uncompromising adhesion to Netball NZ standards, rules regulations and policies.
- 7. Operate within the rules of netball including national and international guidelines which govern Netball NZ, the Zone and Netball Centres
- 8. Understand your responsibility if you breach, or are aware of any breaches of this Code of Conduct & Ethics.
- 9. Do not use your involvement with Netball NZ, a Zone or Netball Centre to promote your own beliefs, behaviours or practices where these are inconsistent with those of Netball NZ, a Zone or a Netball Centre.
- 10. Wherever possible avoid unaccompanied and unobserved activities with persons under 18 years of age.
- 11. Refrain from any form of abuse towards others.
- 12. Refrain from any form of harassment towards, or discrimination of, others.
- 13. Provide a safe environment for the conduct of any netball or netball related activity.
- 14. Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- 15. Be a positive role model.
